History: This fast growing tree is native to Australia. It is ready for harvest every 2 years even if the tree is cut down. Australian aboriginals have been using it for years as an antibacterial agent and other medicinal purposes. Tea tree cutters and producers in Australia were exempt from military service during WW 2 as military personnel in the allied forces were issued the oil in their first aid kits.

Mind: Energy stimulant
